### Hogs on the Lam: Large, Intelligent, Invasive and in your Back Forty

Ryan Brook grew up on a farm in southern Manitoba and was fascinated by both farming and wildlife. Now, as an Associate Professor in the College of Agriculture and Bioresources, he is captivated by the interactions between wildlife and agriculture: this leads him to work on many things, among them wild boar and feral pigs.

Ryan will talk about the biology of wild pigs and their rapid increase in population here and around the world. He will talk about the problems that they cause and his team's current research. He will also discuss what might be done to curtail their activities.

## President's Message

We have an early start to winter this year, but there is no need to hibernate as the Field Trip Committee has been busy planning trips, and there are several bird counts in our area in December and early January. See the newsletter for more information. You will note that some of our field trips are scheduled for members only. If you are not a member, we encourage you to become one. Members receive discounts to three local businesses: Don's Photos, Early's, and Wild Birds Unlimited. See the newsletter for details.

Your membership helps support our nature education efforts through financial support to the Young Naturalist Program, which is celebrating its fiftieth anniversary, and our Kids in Nature Grants. In 2018, we granted \$2500 in total to two programs that provided several hundred local school-age children with opportunities to engage in nature and supported Meewasin's Dark Sky Night at Beaver Creek.

Being a member helps strengthen our voice when addressing conservation issues, and in our talks with civic decision makers. We have provided input to several long range planning initiatives including the City's Green Infrastructure Strategy, and recently provided input about upgrades to the portion of the Meewasin Trail from the new Children's Discovery Museum to the Shakespeare on the Saskatchewan site.

Thanks to our current members for your ongoing support. If your membership is up for renewal you will receive an email from Claire Bullaro. If you receive a hard copy of the newsletter the expiry date of your newsletter is on the mailing label. Please consider renewing now if your membership is due for renewal. It helps manage our costs, and reduces volunteer time to send out reminders. You can use the membership form at the end of the newsletter or bring it to the membership table at the next meeting. ## Saskatoon Fall Bird Count, Sep 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018

Thirty-four participants contended with rain showers and wind for part of the day, but still managed a total species count (142) that was six higher than the long-term average (LTA). Single individuals of three seldom-seen species were observed: Blackburnian Warbler, Prairie Falcon and Whooping Crane. For each species it was only the third sighting on the Fall Count since 1995.

All-time (since 1995) high counts were recorded for Ring-necked Duck (253), Lesser Scaup (609), Common Nighthawk (3), Forster's Tern (10), Common Grackle (623), Bay-breasted Warbler (6) and Yellow Warbler (48). Mountain Bluebirds were at an 8-year high (84), but still only 74% of their LTA.

Some long-term trends are noticeable when 5-year average counts since 1995 are compared. The most general decline is among sparrows where all but Vesper and Lincoln's Sparrow have declined at least 50%. The most significant declines (1995-99 average, 2014-18 average) are American Tree Sparrow (14, 1), Dark-eyed Junco (266, 11), Harris's Sparrow (18, 1), Song Sparrow (26, 8) and Swamp Sparrow (9, 1). Other declining species include Greater White-fronted Goose (1895, 292), Western Grebe (60, 8), Black-bellied Plover (12, 1), Pectoral Sandpiper (22, 2), Bonaparte's Gull (33, 5), American Crow (3059, 919), Mountain Bluebird (239, 46) and Rusty Blackbird (11, 0).

Among notable long-term upward trends (1995-99 average, 2014-18 average) are Hooded Merganser (4, 20), Gray Partridge (7, 34), Mourning Dove (35, 273), Killdeer (39, 136), Semipalmated Sandpiper (2, 19), Franklin's Gull (488, 1496), Downy Woodpecker (4, 15), Vireos (3, 16), Common Raven (11, 68), Gray Catbird (5, 36) and House Finch (8,76).
